



A virtual seminar for women parliamentarians of the Americas and Caribbean on the Defence, Peace and Security agenda

"With All That's Going on Right Now...": The Challenge of Political Leadership During Crisis



Women parliamentarians remain underrepresented in committees and other leadership positions related to the security and defence sectors. Yet women are often well equipped to play active roles in dialogue and decision-making in these areas and to advocate for the need to assess conflict from a gender-responsive perspective, which is essential to sustainable peacebuilding.

This seminar occurs during a convergence of global security crises. Among them are the Israel-Hamas war and the escalating humanitarian crisis in Gaza, as well as the ongoing Russian-Ukraine war, that have had ramifications around the world. While occurring on soil outside of the Americas and the Caribbean, this region has strong economic, ethnic, religious and other ties to these areas facing conflict which are impacting diaspora communities in particular.

This session will facilitate dialogue and knowledge sharing on big questions such as:

- What does it mean to be a leader right now?
- What are responsible and authentic ways to discuss divisive issues impacting our constituents?
- How can we visibilize the gender impacts of crises near and far, and the work of women peacebuilders?

Recognizing that women leaders often face gender-based obstacles and disproportionate levels of scrutiny in their work, this closed-door virtual seminar aims to provide a safe space for women parliamentarians from the Americas and the Caribbean who wish to engage in constructive and authentic dialogue with peers on difficult issues.

Interpretation will be provided in Spanish, English, French and Portuguese.
