### Young Women in Leadership Network Workshop

Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago | January 22-23, 2026

In recognition of the 30th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, UN Women Multi-County Office-Caribbean, ParlAmericas, and Caribbean Women in Leadership (CIWiL) launched the Young Women in Leadership Network as an ongoing mechanism to provide ongoing support to the alumni of Young Women in Leadership (YWIL) programs and other parliamentary programming in building the knowledge, networks, and skills needed to achieve substantive gender equality.

This workshop will bring together young women leaders from six countries across the region for training in effective communication, advocacy, and project planning for gender equality, as well as intergenerational and cross-regional exchanges on women's leadership and gender equality. Participants will also collaborate on the development of a regional advocacy roadmap focused on young women's leadership and gender-responsive action on priority themes.
