

In this respect, gender equality policy impacts should be taken into account when creating climate adaptation strategies. With its framework, the present draft law creates a basis for appropriate strategies and concepts that have a positive impact on gender equality against the background of climate change. This law is not expected to have any impact on demographic change.


