Review and Update of the Road Map towards Legislative Openness

ParlAmericas convened a series of activities soliciting inputs to update and expand its Road Map towards Legislative Openness. Published in 2016, this document was co-created by legislatures and civil society representatives from across the Americas and the Caribbean, and its pillars of transparency, accountability, citizen participation, and ethics have inspired and shaped open parliament commitments and action plans at national levels.

Online Survey

The review process started with an online survey which was distributed in December 2020 to identify which topics and aspects should be included in the new edition of the Road Map. Representatives of parliaments and civil society from 24 countries contributed to the findings.

Inter-Parliamentary Meetings

Once the submissions of the survey were organized, virtual meetings were held to discuss the concrete changes and updates that would be included in the new edition, taking into account the experiences and work priorities identified by representatives of parliaments and civil society organizations in the hemisphere, in favour of promoting legislative openness.

- Co-creation meeting between parliamentarians and representatives of civil society organizations who are members of the Latin American Network for Legislative Transparency, which was attended by 18 representatives from 10 countries (May 17)

Next Steps

Following the organization of the contributions received at each of the meetings, a draft of the new Road Map will be posted online for the submission of additional comments. Afterwards, the Executive Committee of the Open Parliament Network will approve the final version before its official launch. The new edition of the Road Map will include the updated definition of open parliament, emphasizing the value and importance of co-creation processes, a re-organization of the key aspects in each pillar, as well as new concepts added to the glossary.

A new edition of the <u>Legislative Transparency Index</u> will also be launched this year, based on a <u>new methodology</u> that was presented at one of the meetings in the Road Map review process. This Index was prepared by civil society organizations that are part of the Latin American Network for Legislative Transparency and measures policies for legislative openness in place since 2011 by evaluating regulations, work, budgets and administrative management, as well as citizen participation .The new index will be in line with the pillars of open parliament, in order to cover a greater number of topics.

MAIN CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE ROAD MAP TOWARDS LEGISLATIVE OPENNESS

- The incorporation of and emphasis on co-creation as a central aspect of open parliament and its promotion in commitments and action plans
- The incorporation of technological innovation across all pillars of open parliament, taking into account the digital transformation processes in legislative branches related to the transition to virtual sittings

- The consolidation of mechanisms for parliamentary oversight, including the comprehensive monitoring of progress with regard to issues that are national priorities, such as the Sustainable Development Goals and the fight against corruption

- The adoption of public integrity systems to ensure compliance with codes of ethics and lobbying laws, and the provision of technical support to parliamentarians and parliamentary staff with regard to these issues
